DESIRED PROJECT ATTRIBUTES:

- -Matches interests of students and is feasible, within student's capabilities
- -Clear applications to applied policy or management issues
- -6 months in duration
- -Interdisciplinary projects of a synthetic nature
- -Emerging issue areas preferred

EXAMPLE PRODUCTS:

- -Information synthesis
- -Data synthesis and analysis
- -Public opinion surveys; expert elicitation

PREVIOUS UCD GROUPS HAVE ADDRESSED:

-Climate change vulnerability assessments for USFWS wild-life refuges

PARTNER SUPPORT:

Monetary support from partner organization is desired, but not required. Funding from the partner organization would support minor project costs. A primary contact person at the partner organization will be identified and will be in contact with the UCD team to provide input and direction over the course of the project.

COLLABORATIVE APPROACH:

- -Groups of 3 to 6 students
- -A faculty lead
- -A primary contact person from the partner institution

OCTOBER 2018: Project contract JANUARY 2019- JUNE 30, 2019: Project commencement to completion
