Referencing Guide

- **1. Cite all sources** with in-text citation and list in the "References" Section at the end of the document.
 - In-text citations: these appear within your text
 - Reference list entries: these appear in a "References" section at the end of the document.
- **2.** Use *The Chicago Manual of Style* author-date format. See this guide: https://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org/tools_citationguide/citation-guide-2.html
 - Note examples for in-text citations and reference listings for different types of sources.
 - Note that electronic and Internet resources should be cited formally.

3. Cite Suitable References

- Ok sources generally include: academic journal articles, prominent periodicals, books, leading periodicals
- Do not use lecture notes as a source.
- Use with caution or qualification: advocacy group publications and websites.
- Cite the original sources, not a book or article that cites thes sources. For example, do not cite <u>Wikipedia</u> as a source, but go to the original article that Wikipedia references as the source.
