Fellowships

- A fellowship is the equivalent of a scholarship. You do not have to pay back this award as it is free money with a few strings attached (see eligibility requirements here).
- If the student is receiving a fellowship from the EPM program or from Grad Studies, they will be directly notified of their award via the email that they used in their admission application.
- Students are encouraged to apply for External Fellowships. See tips for finding external funding here.

Academic Appointments

- All on campus positions are posted on our online platform, <u>Handshake</u>. All admitted students will be given access to handshake once they:
 - o Submit their Statement of Intent to Register (SIR).
 - o Register for classes for the fall quarter (typically in mid-June).
- Teaching Assistantships
 - Teaching Assistants are responsible for the conduct of recitation, laboratory or quiz sections under active direction and supervision of a regular member of faculty to whom the final responsibility for the course's entire instruction is assigned.
 - Teaching Assistantships are awarded by academic departments. EPM does not directly award students TAships, but we encourage all students to apply.

- The application for our department (Environmental Science & Policy) will be sent to all admitted students in Mid-April. You will be notified if you are selected for a TA position directly. You will not be notified if you do not receive anything.
- You may be qualified to TA for a course through a different department. We recommend that you contact <u>departments</u> directly to request an application. Each department may have a different process and deadline.
- Any TA position 25% or greater covers tuition & fees + you will receive salary. For more on Salary Scales, please see here.

• Graduate Student Research Assistantships

- Graduate Student Researcher assists in performing research under the direction of a ladder-rank faculty member or authorized Principle Investigator (PI).
- Research Assistantships are awarded by individual faculty members from faculty research grants. These positions are typically awarded to students within research programs, however some EPM students have obtained these positions.
- Any GSR position 25% or greater covers tuition + fees and nonresident supplemental tuition (NRST). The student will also receive salary.
 - Salary is determined by your hiring unit. See salary steps <u>here</u>. Typically a
 first-year student will begin between Step 3- Step 5, but while this is the
 general norm this is **not** a rule.
 - Summer GSR's can be worked up to 100%, and percentage is determined between the PI, Accounting Staff and the student. Tuition + fees are not accessed in the summer and <u>are not included even if you register for</u> summer courses.

Work Study

- Work study allows a study to earn financial aid through employment.
- Work study requires a student to receive a GSR position and be deemed eligible by Financial Aid, which is determined based on their review of your FAFSA.
 - It is only available for GSRs, it is not available for any other position.
- EPM does not provide you with a GSR position. If you find one, we do have available work study credits which will only be available to you if Financial Aid deems you eligible.

Reader

 The title Reader is given to a graduate or undergraduate student appointed for the ability to render diverse services as a course assistant, which will normally include the grading of student papers and examinations. Job duties can vary depending on the instructor.

• Any reader position 25% or greater covers tuition & fees + an hourly wage.

Student Loans

- Please note, Pell Grants are generally for undergraduate students only.
